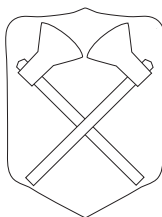

GOODS & SERVICE TAX:

I would have supported Senator Len Normans' proposition to delay the implementation of GST. Please note this was to delay GST it was not NO to GST.

We have been told there was no alternative to GST. I do not accept this. For example, adjustments to Social Security could have removed the need for the £60 million per annum supplementation to the Social Security fund which comes out of our taxes.

This would have meant:

- No increase in civil servants.
- No extra costs for businesses to administer and collect.
- No threat to our retailers by the introduction of the £400 GST free importation allowance.

Did Deputies de Faye, Huet & Fox, who voted for GST and against the decision to delay its implementation, really look hard enough at this alternative?

Ask them why they turned it down and went for the easy option. A 3% tax has ended up as at least a 5% increase on retail prices even before the international price increase in global commodities.
